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Dear Friends

Many of our members will have been shocked to hear of the death of Gabriel Stocks, in a tragic accident on the flooded River Thames.

Gabriel, a former member of our branch, had worked tirelessly for people with MS. He was once a key member of the Thames Valley Regional Committee in the role of web manager. He was also a founding member of the Henley branch, which he had served as chairman and treasurer.

He died after trying to negotiate the flooded and unlit towpath beside the swollen Thames on his mobility scooter at Osney. Both he and the machine went into the water. Gabriel was pulled out, but pronounced dead at the scene. The Thames had overflowed due to the recent heavy storms.

Gabriel was a 47-year-old single

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man and retired engineer and lived in Kelham Hall Drive, Wheatley.

After the accident, Superintendent Christian Bunt, Oxford police commander, appealed to people to stay away from flood areas.

He said: "This tragic incident highlights the dangers of using pathways which have flooded. The public should be particularly careful following the recent heavy rainfall, especially along the River Thames, and ensure they do not put themselves at risk by entering flood water. I urge anyone using these areas to take extra caution."

Sue Hannaford, the MS Society's local support development officer, said: "Gabriel was a lovely man, a great committee member and was passionate about supporting people with and affected by MS."

Death is said to have been due to drowning with a contributory cause of multiple sclerosis. A full inquest will be heard later.

RESEARCH UPDATE

FIRST PILL

An Oxford drug company has developed the first pill to treat relapsing and remitting MS. In the past, the only treatment was through injections.

However, Genzyne, based at the Oxford Business Park at Cowley, has now had its pill, Aubagio, approved by Nice, the National Institute for Clinical Excellence. It is said to slow the degenerative effects of MS.

The advance has been welcomed by the MS Society, which described it as excellent news for people with MS.

Spokesman Jenna Mahoney said: "There are a number of treatments for this sort of MS, but they are all injectable. This offers people an alternative for the first time."

She said that in a recent MS Society survey, a huge proportion of people with MS said they would prefer a tablet to an injection.

MEL DAVIES

Our branch was well represented at the funeral of Mel Davies, a member and supporter for many years. Mel came to our Open Day with his wife Nancy, who had MS, and continued to attend after she died. He moved from his home at Didcot to a care home in Sussex a year ago to be near his family and died on New Year's Day.

The family decided to bring Mel back to Didcot for the funeral – many of his friends and colleagues attended the service at St Peter's Church.

Afterwards, fittingly, a reception was held at Didcot Railway Club – Mel had worked on the railways at Didcot for 48 years, first as a locomotive fireman and later as a driver, after leaving his native South Wales as a teenager.

The MS Society's three-year partnership with The Recycling Factory is paying handsome dividends, with more than £50,000 raised for MS through members' recycling efforts.
