#### DRUGS BLOCKED

The MS Society is challenging a decision to block access to two treatments that have improved significantly the quality of life for people with MS.

Fampyra has helped people to walk more easily while Sativex has helped ease painful muscle spasms. But in its draft clinical guidelines for MS, NICE (the National Institute for Care and Health Excellence) has decided not to recommend the two treatments.

The guidelines also fail to recommend that people with MS be reviewed by MS specialists, such as an MS nurse or neurologist.

The MS Society has urged NICE to reconsider its decisions on the drugs and stressed the value of MS specialists in the treatment, care and support of people with MS.

NICE is reviewing responses to the draft document and expects to publish its final guidelines in October.

#### **MS WINDFALL**

The MS Society's two-year partnership with Land Securities, owners of the Westgate Centre in Oxford, proved hugely profitable.

Thirty-one branches, including our own, took part in a wide range of fundraising activities at 20 of the company's shopping complexes and raised a total of £216,312 for MS. Some branches went to town, with events including swimming with sharks, fire walks and abseils.

As we reported in the May/June newsletter, our share of the proceeds from collections and sales at the Westgate was £1,816.49.
